



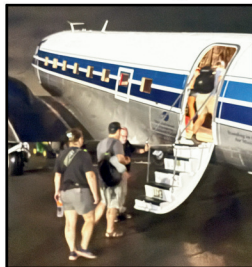

It has been over four years since a regular team joined us on a trip to Mission Experience Haiti. This fall, we were blessed to have a small team of 5 join me to visit our Haitian family. To say that everyone was excited for a team to arrive is an understatement. Even James wrote me a note the night before, saying how excited he was for us to get there. The children and staff waited with anticipation. All they knew was that a team was coming, and all of them had been on a previous trip before. When we pulled in, John, Stephen, Natalie, Emily, and Mart got out of the cars, and the kids went crazy. They jumped, yelled, and ran to their missionary family. They were so excited!

This trip was a huge success, as we are still temporarily in a different part of the country, which presents a broad learning curve. One warning/encouragement that we give to all team members on a trip to Haiti is that you have to be flexible. A trip never goes according to plan. This one was no different, but the team adapted well. The writer of Proverbs penned these words years ago, "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes His steps" (ESV). These words still ring true thousands of years later. The team knew they were in for a different sort of trip when they had to fly Missionary Flights International instead of a commercial airline, which have ceased going into Haiti until at least March 2026. The only way to get there is on an older



DC-3 with the missionary airline. They use this older plane since it is better equipped to land in fields, which they do a couple times a week. When we arrived, the heat and humidity hit you in the face as usual, but as soon as we exited the airport, there were James and some of the boys waiting eagerly for us. We even stopped at a restaurant for lunch on the way to see the kids. Haitian chicken wings for everyone!

The primary focus of this trip was to spend time with

the kids, encouraging, teaching, playing, and worshipping with them.

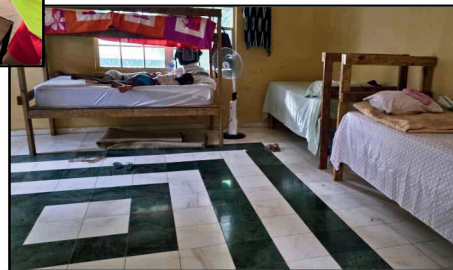


We had one construction goal. Since we have moved to our temporary location, the kids and staff have been sleeping on mattresses on hard tile floors. We desperately wanted to build bed frames to get everyone off the floor; however, the goal was not just for the American team to do it. They could have completed this assignment in just a few days, but their goal was to teach the teens how to construct and build their own beds. They did a great job of doing this!! It was amazing to watch Emily teach the girls how to measure and use a chop saw while Natalie kept the little ones busy.



John, Stephen, and Mart taught the boys how to assemble the beds. If we need any in the future, I am positive that the kids can build their own.

A huge thanks to this team for joining me. The kids love it when I come, but their hearts pump with extra enthusiasm when others come with me!!

We have raised all the money we need to purchase property in the North to start building God's Garden North and construct a wall around the property. Thank you all for your generosity!!! When we find a property, we will send out pictures. Please keep praying about this. Our next step will be to raise money to build out the property. We will share the architectural drawings in a few months. They are being created now and finalized after we buy the property. Land is expensive in Haiti because there is only so much on the Island, but we can build much cheaper. Our goal to build the entire thing is \$200,000. We have already raised \$50,000.
